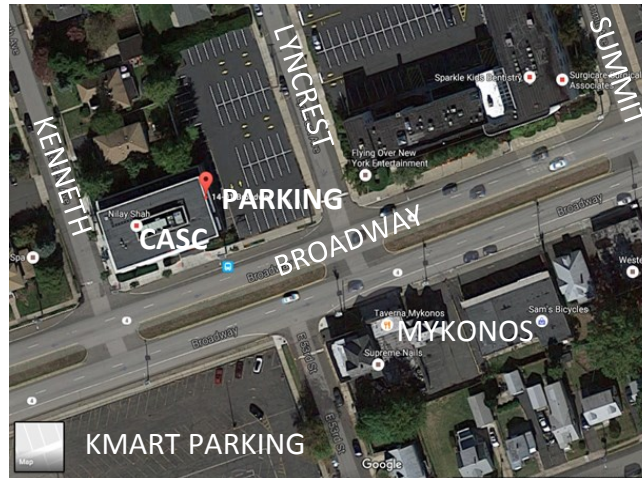

WELCOME

The Children's Ambulatory Surgery Center of New Jersey (CASC) is a state-of-the-art facility designed to meet the outpatient pediatric surgical needs of children from infancy through adolescence. Our patient-centered approach is complimented by advanced technology and highly trained staff dedicated to providing care for all patients with physical, developmental and special needs.

The Children's Ambulatory Surgery Center is fully licensed by the State of New Jersey Department of Health and received the Coin of Excellence from the Accreditation Association for Ambulatory Health. This ensures that we, as an institution, are committed to providing the highest standard of patient care and safety.

Our goal is to provide outstanding pediatric surgical care delivered by an expert team of healthcare professionals in a warm and welcoming environment.

We invite all patients and their families to tour our center, meet our staff, and discuss any questions or concerns prior to the scheduled procedure.



ANESTHESIA

Anesthesiology plays a pivotal role in the treatment and recovery of pediatric patients. Having a surgical procedure can be a scary time for a child and stressful for his/her parents. Our highly trained pediatric board certified anesthesiologists will hold an interview prior to the start of the scheduled procedure. During this time, they will do everything possible to alleviate any concerns by helping you better understand the entire process.

Parents are allowed to be with their child at all times prior to surgery. In most cases, one parent may accompany his or her child to the operating room and may be present during the initial phase of anesthesia. Blankets, dolls, music or electronics are welcomed to provide comfort at this time.

PRIOR TO PROCEDURE

- We will contact you a few days prior to your child's scheduled visit to discuss important factors and necessary documentation relating to his/her surgery. An additional phone call is made the day before the procedure to confirm time of arrival and transportation.
- It is very important to follow strict eating and drinking guidelines for the safety of your child. He/she should not have anything to drink after midnight the night before the procedure, unless otherwise instructed.
- Have your child bathe or shower the evening before surgery.
- Have your child wear comfortable, loose fitting clothing.
- Leave all jewelry and valuables at home.

DAY OF PROCEDURE

- Please bring insurance information, and a photo ID for the parent or guardian representing the child.
- Maintain strict eating and drinking guidelines as discussed prior to the procedure.
- Notify the nurse, surgeon, and anesthesiologist of any changes noted in your child's health (fever, cold, or any other illnesses).
- Bring a list of current medications.
- If needed, bring any item that may make your child more comfortable.

POST PROCEDURE

- Once the procedure is completed, your child will be escorted to the recovery room and be cared for by specially trained pediatric nurses and anesthesiologists. At this time, we will bring you to the bedside so that you may be fully involved with the care of your child.
- Discharge instructions will be discussed and also written down for reference once you are at home.
- Please call us at 201-791-0100 with any questions or concerns you may have after you have left the center.
- Follow up appointments are very important. If you do not already have one scheduled, be sure to call your surgeons office after discharge.
